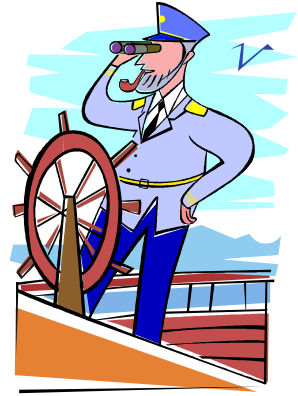

Once an album is selected the thumbnails of the album are shown. Select any picture to see it in regular size. The number of the picture is identified and **>>** takes you to next picture and **<<** takes you to the previous picture.

The choice is yours to select individual pictures or page thru the entire album.

Comments.

At the bottom of each picture is the ability to make a **comment** on the picture as well as see other comments. Humor is appreciated. Feel free to identify "who" is in the picture.

Hint:

Clicking on any picture will take it to its own screen and clicking again will enlarge the picture. Right click on any picture and you can make your own copy.

On Saturday, April the 9th, the Detroit Parrot Head Club made a two mile stretch of Van Dyke Road look a little better. The Parrot Head / Adopt-A-Highway Program began it's 2011 litter pickup season on that slightly chilly spring morning. As a group we have never looked better than we did that day. The pictures here, and many more thanks to Caryn G., are posted on the Club's website. If you were not there you should have been, because it's really hard to describe what happened. A new spirit has taken hold of our group. Everyone there arrived with a new enthusiasm, ready to take on this new year of service to our community. Not to mention the challenge of the unknown.



What discarded items were hiding under all that Michigan snow, that melted only a few weeks before? It was a good thing for us that a larger than normal group of Parrot Heads joined in, to tackle a larger than normal amount of paper, plastic, wood, and metal debris scattered between 16 and 18 Mile Roads. I reported to MDOT and the Macomb County office on Mound Road that a total of 26 large, green and white, MDOT litter bags awaited their pick up along Van Dyke. We also did a good job for the 2010 spring clean up. We picked up everything, but when we were done only 13 bags were seen at the sidewalks, that spring day last year. Besides the 26 bags this year, we also gathered large pieces of wood, drywall and a car fender or two. Dan P. is pretty sure he found a lost CD of Cat Stevens greatest hits.

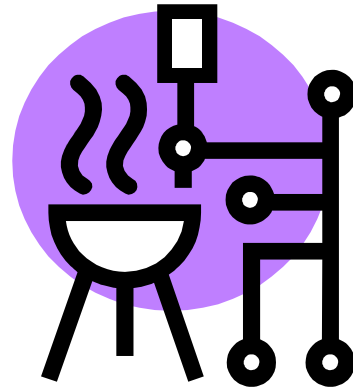
BBQ Ranch Bacon Cheeseburger

This is a “Thick Juicy Seasoned cheeseburger topped with savory-sweet Barbecue Sauce and slices of bacon “

Original Recipe Yield 6 cheeseburgers

Ingredients

2 pounds ground sirloin beef
1 (1 ounce) package ranch salad and seasoning mix
1/2 cup Hunt's® Original Barbecue Sauce
1/2 cup ranch dressing
Nonstick cooking spray
1 (2.1 ounce) package fully cooked bacon, heated
6 slices Monterey Jack cheese, each slice cut diagonally into 2 triangles
1 (16 ounce) package French bread rolls, sliced in half lengthwise, toasted
6 leaves green leaf lettuce
French-fried onions (optional)



Directions

Mix ground beef with seasoning mix in large bowl until well blended. Shape beef into 6 oblong patties, about 6 x 3-inches each. Whisk together barbecue sauce and dressing in small bowl; set aside.

Spray grate of outdoor grill and utensils with grilling spray. Preheat grill to medium heat. Grill patties 5 minutes on one side or until juices begin to appear on surface. Turn patties over; top each with 3 slices bacon. Cook about 4 minutes longer; top each patty with 2 triangle pieces of cheese, overlapping

to cover patty. Remove patties when cheese begins to melt.

Spread barbecue-dressing mixture on bottom of each roll. Add a lettuce leaf.

Place cooked patty with bacon and cheese on lettuce. Spoon additional barbecue-dressing mixture over cheese. Sprinkle with fried onions, if desired.

Serve immediately

Vanilla Rum and Coke

Makes 2 cocktails (right)

6 Tablespoons Rum
1 Cup of Coke
¼ teaspoon Vanilla Extract
2 Wedges

Fill Each Glass almost to the top with Ice cubes. To each glass add half the Rum, Coke and Vanilla . Squeeze the orange Wedges into the cocktails and drop the into the each drink, Stir and Serve ..

Cherry Coke Ice Cream Float

1 can Cherry Coke (Diet Cherry Coke is Awesome to)
Two Scoops of Cherry Maraschino Ice Cream
Whipped Cream (or Cool Whip)
1 or 2 Maraschino Cherries with Stem (For decoration)

TIP: The Soda will fizz way to much if you pour it over the ice cream , the secret is filling the glass about ½ full with the Coke, and then putting the scoops of Ice Cream in Top with Whip cream and Cherries.
